*Mysterious Death of a Young Woman—The Quota
of the District—A Divorce.*

An investigation by a coroner's jury was undertaken this afternoon in regard to the death of Miss Margaret Ann Duvall, aged 21 years, when her funeral was about to take place from her father's (Mr. Amon Duvall's) residence, on Seventh street. It appears the young lady was recently one of the employees in the note-printing bureau of the Treasury Department, and from certain developments, suspicions arose as to the cause of her death. She had, however, been ill for some weeks. The coroner's verdict had not been rendered when this was closed.

The quota of the District is not only filled, but an excess of 73 men has been furnished.

The wife of Charles E. Lusby has just obtained a divorce from her husband in the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, on the ground of desertion three months after marriage, maintained now for over two years. She was granted the custody of her child, the husband to support it.
